

CHURCH BUILDING USE REMINDER

The beginning of a new year is a perfect time to review our procedures for using the church building. We ask all groups using the church building to help keep the building clean and safe by following these simple rules.

When leaving the building, please make certain that:

• The space you have used has been returned to the condition in which you found it. All books, papers, equipment, and musical instruments should be put



- All lights are turned off. This will help the church save money on our electricity bill!
- All radiators are turned down to the "snowflake" position. This will help the church save money on heating costs.
- All doors in the building are close and all exterior doors are closed and locked.
- The alarm system has been properly activated. If the alarm is set-off and the police respond, the church is charged a \$50.00 fee

When planning a meeting or event at the church, please remember:

- All activities must be added to the church calendar. Please check with the church office to make certain that your event will not conflict with an another, already planned event.
- The church building is scheduled on a first come, first served basis. So, please schedule you special events in advance!

Outside groups and weddings must receive approval from the Stewardship Ministry Team to use the church building. Please request a **Building Use Form** from the church office. Please return your complete Building Use Form to the office for approval <u>at least one month before your event's date</u>.

Use of Church Supplies and Equipment

- <u>Church supplies and equipment cannot leave</u> <u>the church property without permission</u> Please contact the church office for permission, before removing any supplies or equipment from the church.
- <u>Lending of church tables and chairs:</u> the church lends out old tables and chairs to church members for special events (graduation parties, family celebrations, etc.) To borrow these items, please contact the church office. All tables and chairs must be returned to the church by the agreed upon date and time.

As we enter a new year, there is a cold wind of fear and hatred blowing through our nation. Politicians seeking the highest office in the land have proposed banning Muslims from entering our nation, a moratorium on refugee resettlement, banning Syrian refugees from the country, and monitoring mosques. Hate-filled speech has fueled hate crimes. A week ago, a Muslim shopkeeper in New York City was beaten because of his religious identity. In Philadelphia, a pig's head was placed outside a Muslim community center. In California, while Muslims gathered to pray in their mosque someone set it on fire.

Sadly, this cold wind has blown through our community as well. Many of our community's leading citizens are members of Utica's century-old Syrian community. Our

city is known internationally as "the town that loves refugees" because of our successful welcome and integration of refugees from around globe into the fabric of our community. Nevertheless, even in Utica, a city councilor recently proposed an ordinance restricting the resettlement of Syrian refugees for two years.

How should we respond to the fear and hatred that has begun to swirl around us? **We need to remember who we are**. Our identity as Americans is shaped by our nation's foundational commitment to religious liberty. Freedom of religion has been called America's "first freedom." It is enshrined in the first amendment to our national constitution and guarantees us the right to worship as we choose free from governmental intrusion and interference. Our nation has also been shaped by successive waves of immigrants. The Statue of Liberty in New York harbor has welcomed the world's "tired, poor, and huddled masses yearning to breathe free" who have, in repayment, breathed new life and vitality into our country.

We also need to confront the fear and hatred around us out of **our identity as Christians**. When Jesus is asked what the greatest commandment is, he responds, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind.' This is the greatest and first commandment. And a second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.'" (Matthew 22:37-39) This is not a new teaching. Jesus is paraphrasing the Hebrew scriptures (see Deuteronomy 6:5 and Leviticus 19:18). The message is simple: we cannot fully love God without loving others.

But, the Bible does not allow us to limit our love and concern to those nearest and most like us. As **people of faith, our love must also extend to those who are strangers to us**. Leviticus 19:34 says, "When a foreigner resides with you in your land, you shall not oppress the foreigner. The foreigner who resides with you shall be to you as the citizen among you; you shall love the foreigner as yourself, for you were foreigners in the land of Egypt." In Matthew's gospel, Jesus says that we will be judged on the basis of our care and concern for those who marginalized, in need, and suffering. In fact, he says that when we welcome the stranger, we welcome him. And, in rejecting the stranger, we reject him. (see Matthew 25:31-46) **The Bible is clear: God cares about those who have been driven from their homes, displaced from their land, and forced to seek refuge. The Bible is also clear that God expects God's people to care about those for whom God cares.**

Let me suggest a very practical way we can begin to combat the fear and hatred around us. Fear and hatred grow in the soil of ignorance. We root-out ignorance and plant seeds of knowledge as we get to know our neighbors of different backgrounds and faith traditions. The Interfaith Coalition of Greater Utica is sponsoring a series of **multi-faith conversations** beginning in January. These meetings are intended to help us move from being strangers with our neighbors of other religions to becoming friends and companions. **The first of these multi-faith conversations will be held at the First Presbyterian Church, 1605 Genesee Street in Utica on Monday, January 11 at 5:30 p.m.** I encourage you to participate.

The Bible tells us, "There is no fear in love, but perfect love drives out fear." (1 John 4:18) What a wonderful New Year's resolution! Let us resolve to drive out fear from our lives and our community. We can do this in 2016 by getting to know those who are today strangers from other faiths. As strangers become friends we replace ignorance with knowledge and we allow love to grow and drive out fear.
