



Pastor's Page

Winning Over Worry

Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. - Philippians 4:6-7 (NRSV)



In those moments when I am feeling particularly stressed-out, stretched too thin, or overwhelmed I recite these verses that I first memorized long ago as a Sunday School student. The Apostle Paul was someone who knew a thing or two about the stresses of life. At this point in his life, Paul was old and ill, sitting in jail, only able to write letters of encouragement to the churches he had planted and nurtured. The Philippian church was one such church. Like Paul himself, it was a church going through hard times.

The Apostle gives us a three-part prescription to winning over worry, restoring our balance, and renewing our spiritual health. First, *Do not be worried about anything*. Another translation says, *Be anxious for nothing*. There are so many things to be anxious about in our daily lives. What makes you anxious? Is it your children's welfare, your teenager's social life, your finances, your job, your health, or your future? There are many situations in life that we feel we have little control over. For many of us, when we lose a

sense of control our anxiety and stress levels climb!

Let me share a secret with you. If we allow those things in life which trigger our anxiety – the uncontrollable factors in our lives – to control us, we become incapable of receiving God's love and love of those around us. So, the Apostle Paul admonishes us, *Be anxious for nothing.* Let go of your fears and anxieties! Trust God! God IS in control. God holds you securely in God's hand. God will be God: today, tomorrow, and always.

The second secret for winning over worry is to be *Prayerful in everything*. The reason we can be anxious for nothing, is the God is always powerfully present to us in prayer. So, the Apostle says, in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God.

Do want live a less stressful life? Talk to God in prayer. God wants all of your prayers. God wants to hear from you when you are happy and joyful, as well as when you are defeated and depressed. God wants to hear about your fears and concerns, as well as your hopes and dreams. God wants to be vitally present in your life. God wants us to be prayerful in everything.

The final secret for winning over worry is to be *Thankful in everything*. Notice the preposition Paul uses. He doesn't say, "<u>For</u> everything with thanksgiving." He is not saying that we should be thankful for everything that happens in life. Sometimes there are awful, horrible, brutal, evil events in our lives, in the lives of those we love, and in our world. Paul does not instruct us to be thankful for those things. Instead, he says, **in** whatever circumstance you may find yourself, be thankful. Be thankful **in** anything.

Being thankful in anything means that we trust God to be present in all the events of life – even life's most painful and destructive circumstances. We can always count on the love of God. God will always be by our side, no matter what we face. That is the reason we can be thankful in anything. It is based on our confidence that whatever may come our way, the risen Christ stands by our side.

If we live our lives this way: Anxious in nothing – Prayerful in everything – Thankful in anything. What is the result? PEACE! And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus.

Restoration and Preservation Fund Update



In May, bids went out for our project. We included all the work we hoped to do. Unfortunately, we only got one authentic bidder but fortunately, that bidder was our preferred contractor. However, the bid was for quite a bit more money than we anticipated. With permission and approval of our grantors, we have worked with the contractor and architects to reduce the scope of our first project to buttresses and the Davison Tower. We have undergone exploratory testing (asbestos and wood rot) and hope to purchase the required stone soon.

We are in need of a volunteer or two to help us make a sign that we must post on our property (28"x20") signifying our Restoration Project has been the recipient of a grant from the NYS Office of Parks, Recreation, and Historic Preservation. Please call David Tomidy if you are interested.

With the reduction of scope, we should have enough funds to apply for additional grant funding in 2017. You are welcome to call Dave Tomidy, at 796-8693, if you have any thoughts or comments on this project.

Are You Registered to Vote?

One of the rights our nation offers its citizens is the ability to choose those who serve us in government. All Tabernacle's friends and members are encouraged to exercise their voting rights this fall. As a congregation we do not endorse candidates or political parties. (Out unity is found in our identity as Christ's disciples, not in a political affiliation.) We trust that Tabernacle's friends and members will thoughtfully and prayerfully cast their votes for those they believe are best able to lead our communities and nation.



If you have not yet registered to vote, <u>voter registration forms</u> are available on the literature table in Thorn Chapel. To vote, you must:

- be a <u>United States citizen</u>;
- you must be 18 years old by the date of the election in which you want to vote
- live at your present address at least 30 days before an election;
- not be in prison or on parole for a felony conviction and;
- not claim the right to vote elsewhere.

If you need help completing the voter registration form, please speak with Pastor Mark or the church office. <u>Applications must be postmarked no later than October 14th</u> to vote in the General Election on Tuesday, November 8. 
