DEDICATION OF THE DAVISON TOWER OF REFUGE SUNDAY- APRIL 22 at 10:00 a.m.

On Sunday, April 22 we will dedicate the beautifully restored Davison Tower of Refuge at the 10:00 a.m., Worship Service. We are looking forward to this special event with much anticipation.

We are grateful for the generous individual contributions as well as a special grant from The New York Landmarks Conservancy, "Sacred Sites" program. We are also thankful to report that the balance of the restoration of the tower has been completely paid and that no monies had to be taken out of the regular church funds to do so. In addition to this special service being an opportunity to give thanks for the generous contributions, it will be a service of praise to God for His provisions.



We are also excited that Rev Jim and Mrs. (Edith) Davison, their son, Scott and daughter, Nancy Brind will be here for the dedication of the Tower Restoration. The Tower was dedicated to Rev. and Mrs. Davisons in 2015. The Davisons have a special place in the hearts of our Tabernacle church family. Rev. Davison served with distinction as Tabernacle's pastor from 1972 to 1984. In retirement, the Davisons returned to Utica in 1993 and served as a "ministry team" until 2009. In their 28 years of ministry at Tabernacle Baptist Church, by their words, deeds, and example, they inspired the church to open its doors and heart to hundreds of Karen refugees.

On April 22, we will have an opportunity to give thanks for the completion of the Tower and also honor Rev. and Mrs. Davison. We will combine the English and Karen service which will be at 10:00 a.m. At the conclusion of the service we will go outside for the dedication of the Davison Tower of Refuge. Following the dedication, we will have a church luncheon in the Thorn Chapel. The Church Archive Committee also plans to have a display of church historical items and pictures ready for this special day.



A Special Easter Tradition

One of my favorite stories is the story of a small rural church near Knoxville, Tennessee. It was the Easter tradition at the church to have a baptismal service at a nearby river on Easter evening at sundown. Following the baptism, the congregation would gather around a bonfire on the shore, singing and cooking supper.

Once all were gathered, there was a ritual that followed. One of the men would introduce the new church members, give their names, where they lived and their work. Then the rest of the members would form a circle around them while they stayed warm by the fire. Each person in the circle then gave his or her name and said this "My name is.... And if you ever need to do washing and ironing....." "My name is.... If you ever need



name isif you ever need any sewing done...." "My name is....if you ever need a car to go to town...." And around the circle they shared. Then they ate and had a square dance and then, at a certain time, one man, with his thumbs in his overalls, would stand up and say "It's time to go." And everybody left. He lingered behind and with his big shoe, kicked sand over the dying fire. One time the pastor said he went up behind him, "When he saw me," he said, "You know, folks don't ever get closer than this."

The story ends by saying "In that little community, they have a name for what that gathering meant. They call it "Church."

As I read the story, I thought of this church. Oh, the setting is different, the tradition is different and the people are different but "Church" is the same. There is a wonderful connectedness of our members

here at Tabernacle. This is seen in the relationship between our
