The Search Committee has met three more times since November. On December 4, 2016 we met with Rev. Hugenot, ABC/NYS Executive Minister. It was decided to plan congregational meeting to be held February 18 & 19, to meet with our congregation for us to begin discussions regarding our expectations of a new Pastor. More information about these meetings can be found on page 6. This process of finding a new Pastor for our Church consists of three steps:

- using Pulpit Supply (for weekly Sunday Worship services) until
- an Interim (Temporary) Pastor is hired until
- the congregation calls a full time Pastor.

In the past, this process usually takes 1-2 years.

The Committee has scheduled pulpit supply through the end of February and will continue until an Interim Pastor is hired.

Search Committee Congregational Meetings

On Saturday, February 18 at 1:00 & 5:30 p.m. and Sunday, February 19 (after the English speaking service), Tabernacle Baptist offers all church members to come and talk about our ministry needs with the departure of Pastor Mark and the beginnings of searching for a new pastor to work alongside Pastor Daniel.

The search committee encourages you to attend conversation sessions to be offered in Karen and in English. These sessions will focus on Tabernacle's present and future ministry, and your participation helps the search committee begin its work with your input early in its work.

Two sessions will be offered on Saturday, February 18, 2017. For our older congregants who may not wish to be out after dark or any other congregant who wishes to be part of an afternoon time discussion group, we will begin at 1 p.m. with light refreshments and conclude later in the afternoon. The youth and any person who wishes to come to an evening time discussion will gather at 5:30 p.m.

A light meal will be served prior to the evening session, beginning at 5 p.m. All are welcome to come and enjoy the meal.

A Sunday morning session will be offered after the English speaking worship service (approx. 11:15 AM) if you cannot make either time on Saturday afternoon or evening. This will take place in the East Room.

NOTE: If we have snow that cancels this event on February 18 and 19th, we will hold the same event, same schedule on the following of February 25 and 26th. We will announce a snow cancellation through phone calls and posts on Facebook on Thursday, February 16, 2017. Please check if you have a question.

The discussions will be offered in Karen and English. The weekend's discussion groups will be supported by three American Baptist staff: Rev Jerrod Hugenot (ABCNYS Associate Executive Minister) will be joined by two staff members from the American Baptist Home Mission Societies: the Rev. Florence Li, Asian Ministries Coordinator and the Rev. Ler Htoo, Karen Ministry Coordinator. Rev Li and Rev Htoo have significant experience working with churches in our denomination whom have an intercultural ministry and will help facilitate discussions in our two main languages spoken at Tabernacle.

The American Baptist Home Mission Societies (ABHMS) commissioned Rev. Ler Htoo as an ABC Home Missionary for with Burma Diaspora communities. Rev. Florence Li is full-time staff at ABHMS working with Asian American constituency and member coordinator for the Burma Refugees Commission. Their time with Tabernacle, along with the ABCNYS Region's staff support from Rev Hugenot and Dr Kelsey, is made possible in part by Tabernacle's contributions to ABC United Mission and the America for Christ Offering.


