Stories engage us because they bring to the surface what we already know, or hoped for but is not readily apparent to us because their truth has not yet taken form in our minds. Stories tap into the deeper wisdom of intuition born of experience.

The deepest truths come clothed in stories. Great stories form the core of our faith. "Abram left, as the LORD had told him." "And Moses said, 'Here, I am.'" "In the sixth month, God sent the angel Gabriel to Nazareth, a town of Galilee, to a virgin pledged to be married to a man named Joseph." "And the Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us." "I saw the Holy City, the new Jerusalem coming down out of heaven." Christians, and the Hebrews before us, have always been great story tellers because we have such fantastic stories to tell. We narrate God's loving work in our world and in our lives.

When we hear what God *has done* in the lives of others and retell what God has done in our lives, we can envision what God *can do*. Our stories plot our future by remembering what God has already done. In the Hebrew Bible, to remember is to believe and to forget is unbelief. Amnesia is a form of atheism in Hebrew thought. Our stories break open to us what is possible under God's grace. So stories, more than facts or argument, move us to action. Therein lies their power.

Our worship services, our Bible study groups, our Sunday School classes, our youth group meetings, and our prayer circles all are places where we tell and retell our faith stories and the stories of others. We do this not because we are mired in the past but because these stories embolden us for the future. Our congregations are story-telling families.

Our Regional Offering supports ministry in our churches. Our world needs to hear how our personal stories have swept up into God's saving story in Christ. The Region works to ensure that there are faithful, courageous congregations in upstate New York to continue the reciting of God's great story in Christ.

In the Region offering materials this year, you will hear some of the stories that the Region ministry is fostering among us. They are great stories because they are a part of the greatest ever told: "God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ." (2 Corinthians 5:19)

Listening for God's Music

A favorite story of mine is about a photograph that was taken by the late Yousaf Karsh who was famous for taking pictures of some of the world's celebrities: Winston Churchill, Mother Teresa and Albert Einstein to name a few.

The photograph was the only one Karsh ever took of a person's back; the back of Pablo Casals in a small French Abby in 1954. He wrote that while he was setting up his equipment, Casals, arguably the greatest cellist who ever lived, began playing his cello. Karsh said he was so enthralled by the music he almost forgot why he was there. So he took the portrait of Casals with the little bald-headed man bent over his cello, frozen in time against a plain stone wall of the chapel. Karsh said he did it to capture the loneliness of the truly great artists and especially this artist living in exile.

Years later, when the por-

trait was on exhibition at the Museum of Fine Art in Boston, an elderly man went day after day and stood for long periods of time in front of the portrait. The curator of the museum noticed him and one day when his curiosity got the best of him, he tapped the man on the shoulder and asked why he stood so long before the picture. The man, with obvious irritation, turned on the curator and said, "Hush, young man! Can't you see I am listening to the music!"

The portrait was so vivid that the man looking at the picture could hear the music. Thinking of that story this Pentecost season, I am reminded of the early church after its Pentecost in-

ception. It was a fellowship of believers from many different backgrounds who joined together with the message of God's love, not letting differences get in the way, just loving the Lord and each other, encouraging each other, supporting each other and putting each other's wishes ahead of their own, so that I think if we were there, we might say in the midst of it all, we hear "God's music."

Of course, there was only one Pentecost but In the short time I have had the privilege of serving as your interim pastor, i have sensed something akin to that. 


