Search Committee Update - Envisioning our Future

On February 18th and 19th Tabernacle hosted congregational meetings with church members and representatives from American Baptist Churches USA to look ahead to what ministry opportunities might be ahead for Tabernacle Baptist Church.

Separate meetings were held for both the adults and for the youth of the church. Rev. Florence Li, the National Coordinator for Intercultural Ministries and member of the Burma Refugee Commis-



sion was the lead speaker. Also in attendance was Rev. Jerrod Hugenot, Associate Executive Minister of the American Baptist Churches of New York State. They led the attendees through a series of discussions and activities, culminating in small group sessions centered around defining the current strengths of Tabernacle, as well as what God might be calling us to do in the future. An explanation of how the American Baptist pastoral search process was also discussed.

Information received from these meetings will help the search committee as they prayerfully begin the process of considering the selection of an Interim pastor; as well as helping the committee as we seek our next Senior Pastor of Tabernacle.

Imitate the Love of God

This is how God showed his love among us: "He sent his one and only Son into the world that we might live through him. This is love: not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins. Dear friends, since God so loved us, we also ought to love one another. No one has ever seen God; but if we love one another, God lives in us and his love is made complete in us." (1 John 4:9-12)

God is love and he loves the whole world. The scriptures say: "For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have everlasting life." (John 3:16)

"Dear friends, let us love one another, for love comes from God. Everyone who loves has been born of God and knows God. Whoever does not have love does not know God, because God is Love." (1 John 4:7-8)

Our religion is founded on love. Its main principle is love. Christians without love are not real Christians, Christian churches without love are not real Christian churches. The two greatest commandments that Jesus signified are:

- "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength" (Deuteronomy 6:4-5)
- "Love your neighbor as yourself." (Leviticus 19:18)

"For God is one and there is no other but him. To love him with all your heart, with all your understanding and with all your strength, and to love your neighbor as yourself is more important than all burnt offerings and sacrifices." (Mark 12:32-33)

This should be our Christian norm. Otherwise, we can not call ourselves Christians. We have to have love when we believe in God. Christian religion grew through love. In early times, Christians were weak and few in number, but they really loved one another so that others said, "Look at them! How much they love so much". They stood firm in faith because of love. Love is the main principle. Imitate God and receive His love. As the hymn says:

"How sweet, how heavenly is the sight, When those that love the Lord In one another's peace delight, And so fulfill His Word."

"And now, Israel, what dos the Lord your God ask of you but to fear the Lord your God, to walk in obedience to him, to love him, to serve the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul." (Deuteronomy 10:12) God bless you richly.




