
- à A special Teacher commitment service to dedicate our teachers for the upcoming school year

Finding Peace in Darkness

Recently, while watching television and reading about the tragedy that took place in Charlottesville, Virginia, my thoughts traveled back to December 2, of 2015.

I was serving as Interim Pastor at the First Baptist Church of Redlands, California which was right next to the city of San Bernardino. It was early December, so I was preparing an Advent message with the theme of "Peace" for the upcoming Sunday. It was then I heard the news about the terrorist attack in San Bernardino—14 people killed and 22 injured. People killed or injured were working in the helping profession, helping people in need, including a young father of 6, who had just given the Advent reading at his church, the Sunday before. Three days later, he was dead. So senseless, heartbreaking. "Works of darkness."

Words fail to adequately describe the pain, shock and sorrow that permeated our community that week. So many questions and so few answers. As people expressed their grief to me, I kept thinking and praying about what to say to these concerned and hurting people, words that would bring comfort and peace.

It was then an Advent prayer and a community gathering guided me in my sermon preparation for the following Sunday. The prayer was in some old worship service notes of mine: "Give us grace that we may cast away the works of darkness and put on the armor of light, the light that is in Christ Jesus."

Two thoughts of the prayer stood out, "Works of Darkness." That was exactly what the terrorist attack represented. It was act of hatred and disregard for human life, an act of evil. "Grace" is what we need to help Office Closed for us speak out against the

hatred, racism and disregard for human life that leads to such horrific acts.

However, that is only part of it. The prayer also reminds us that we are to put on the armor of light, that is in Christ Jesus. Shortly after, I witnessed a wonderful example of what that means.

In the days that followed the shooting, the Imam and members of the Redlands Islamic Center, who had nothing to do with the terrorists, were suffering greatly. It was then in the midst of the darkness of the tragedy, that the light of God's love shown through. We clergy of Redlands, along with the mayor and some officials went to the Islamic Center to show our love and support. After brief remarks were made, we joined hands with the Imam and Islamic leaders and prayed for them, asking God's protection and blessing on them in the midst of this tragedy. Following the joining of hands and praying together, there was a calm that was felt and a sense of the armor of God's light.

With that backdrop, my message on "Peace" for the coming Sunday became clear. In the midst of tragic events, such as San Bernardino and Charlottesville or even those dark times in our own lives when we are wronged or experience injustice, we need to pray for God's grace not to let the dark times swallow us up but rather to put on the armor of light that is in Christ Jesus.— It is our choice.

There is a thoughtprovoking story of an old Native American man talking with his grandson that best explains the difference between being swallowed up by the darkness and putting on the armor of light.

"My son, there is a battle going on between two wolves inside of all of us. One wolf is evil, full of hate, jealousy, greed, resentment, lies and pride. The other is good, joyful, peaceloving, humble, hopeful, kind, caring and truthful. The boy thought for a moment and then said, 'Grandfather, which wolf wins?' The old man quietly replied, 'The one you feed.'"
