the sanctuary with the small red and green envelopes nearby. This is another way we can say "Thank You" to our Retired Ministers and Missionaries!


#### Pastoral Search Informational Meeting

#### Welcoming Our Vulnerable God

. . he emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, being born in human likeness. Philippians 2:7 (NRSV)

During this Advent season, as we prepare our hearts and ready our lives to celebrate the birth of our Lord Jesus Christ on Christmas Day, we do so against the backdrop of a global refugee crisis. The United Nations High Commission on Refugees reports that over 65 million people around the world have been forced from their homes. Half of them are under the age of 18.

The one we worship as Emmanuel – *God with us* – came to us as one of our world's most vulnerable. He was born into a displaced, homeless, refugee family.

The Bible provides us with two accounts of Jesus' birth. The Gospel of Luke not only tells us the picturesque story of angel choirs and shepherds "watching their flocks by night," but of a young couple caught in a tsunami of human migration. Mary and Joseph are forced to move against their will by an imperial decree. They return to the place of Joseph's ancestral origins, Bethlehem, to be counted in the Roman census. The desperate, homeless couple takes shelter among the animals in the stable. There, Mary gives birth to the incarnate Son of God.

Matthew's Gospel tells us the story of how the magi – astrologers from the east – came to Jerusalem seeking the one whose star they had observed and followed. They pay a visit to King Herod seeking "the child who has been born the king of the Jews." Herod responds by slaughtering all the children who might be a rival to his thrown. Fearing for the life of their newborn son, Joseph and Mary flee their homeland for refuge of Egypt.

Toward the end of his ministry, Jesus teaches his disciples about the coming judgement day (see Matthew 25:31-46). There is one criteria by which human beings are judged: their treatment of the most vulnerable. Jesus says that in feeding the hungry, quenching the thirst of the thirsty, welcoming the stranger, caring for the sick, clothing the naked, and visiting the imprisoned we are ministering to him. "... just as you did to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me." And, failure to minister to the vulnerable is a rejection of him. I have often wondered if Jesus was describing in this passage his own experience as the young child of a displaced, stateless, refugee family. To be a refugee is to know the pain of hunger, thirst, and sickness. To be a refugee is to live without adequate shelter and clothing. To be a refugee is to be deprived of your freedom because you are stranger and perceived as a threat.

Almost twenty years ago, Dr. Konrad Raiser, then General Secretary of the World Council of Churches, in his 1997 Christmas message wrote these challenging words about the meaning of Christmas:

This Christmas, God is still on the move with the millions of uprooted people who look for a safe place to be received. Today, to remember and celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ is to do so in a world where millions of people are also compelled to be on the move: refugees driven from their towns and villages by war, children on the road without a home, asylum seekers rejected and deported from a country of refuge, migrants separated from their families. They all knock at our door. Will we open it for them?

The plight of our world's refugees should be of special concern for us during this Advent and Christmas season. Some of our political leaders, professing the desire to restore our nation to greatness and to its "Christian identity," propose building walls, locking our doors, and turning our backs on the world's most vulnerable. If I understand Jesus correctly, saying, "no" to the world's most vulnerable is saying, "no" to him.

During this holy season, may we welcome the one who emptied himself and became vulnerable for our sake. May we see him in the displaced, the stateless, the strangers who seek refuge in our midst. In welcoming them, may we welcome the living Christ.


